- A 23 year of woman presents with low-grade fever, malaise, nocturnal diaphoresis and weight loss over the past 8 weeks. On exam she has a weak right radial pulse and a left infra-scapular bruit. In the last week she has had bilateral transient visual blurring. Her BP=184/50 mm Hg. Her arch angiogram is shown below. Which of the following options is most applicable to her clinical condition:
 - A. After ESR, VDRL, ANA, coagulation and serum chemistries she should undergo prompt endovascular intervention
 - B. Immediate control of her BP can be deleterious
 - C. Treatment with corticosteroids and cyclophosphamide is needed
 - D. Angioplasty offers durable success
 - E. Regardless of the treatment, she faces a low relapse rate



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
